#### Slow Cooker Tomato Tortellini Soup

1 lb. Italian sausage (I used Mike Branting's homemade at Burg grocery)

1 (32 oz.) chicken broth

1 (28 oz.) can petite diced tomatoes

2 (10.75 oz.) cans tomato soup

2 (8 oz.) containers chive & onion cream cheese spread, softened

1 (18 oz.) pkg. refrigerated cheese tortellini, uncooked

In a skillet, cook sausage until browned and transfer to slow cooker.

Add chicken broth, tomatoes & tomato soup to slow cooker. Cover and cook on LOW 6-8 hrs.

Stir in cream cheese and tortellini. Cover and cook on HIGH for 15-30 min. until tortellini is cooked.



#### Meet a Member - Carol Jones



I'm an original Connecticut Yankee, growing up in Fairfield, Connecticut, about 60 miles from NYC. My parents were both children of Swedish immigrants and active in the Lutheran

Church. My brother, Bob, 9 years older than me, was my hero and life-long friend.

We lived just a block away from school. Our neighbors were a variety of ethnicity and I being a nosy little girl, knew all of them. I remember playing among the downed trees after a hurricane, trips to the beach and watching my brother skin the prey he caught.

A lifelong desire to be a nurse, perhaps fed by my fascination with the innards of my brother's critters, led to my decision to go into nursing after high school. At the same time I wanted to see a different part of the country. So I received my RN from the Lutheran School of Nursing in Moline, IL. Part of our training included 4 months at the Pediatric Unit in Cook County Hospital, Chicago. It was there I learned about life. And it was in Chicago where I met my life partner.

One Sunday, my classmate Phyllis and I attended a unique Lutheran church which held services in a downtown office building. Much to Phyllis's surprise, her 2<sup>nd</sup> cousin, Duane Jones was an usher. We decided to return for Sunday night supper and discussion group. Duane drove us back to the nurses' dorm. And the rest is history.

After graduation I moved to Chicago and worked until Duane was discharged from the Army. We were married in April of 1958 and headed west to life on the farm. I was woefully ignorant of farm life – I thought all the corn I saw was sweet corn and that all bulls were black. But I learned, farrowed hogs when Duane was traveling, killed chicken for dinner, but was never in the right place when we were chasing hogs. Most of all I appreciated the closeness of families, the history of Swede Home, the friendliness of neighbors and above all, the church.

Beth (Wienck), Linnea and Mark made our family complete. Beth, who is a Certified Medical Coder, lives in Marysville, KS with her husband, Gary. Mark and his wife, Tammy, whom most of you know, farm in the area. Linnea, a Hospice Social Worker, lives in Lincoln. We have six wonderful grandchildren, sadly losing the seventh, Mark and Tammy's son, Tory David, last July. And 8 wonderful greats, all BOYS!
