Stories are often shared as we gather with friends and family. Children especially love to tell stories with more details than adults. Their stories come to life as they use their whole body in the retelling.

We continue this month with the synod's focus of go and... This month our focus is the "Go and **share your story**." These are the questions the synod encourages us to consider:

When was the last time you listened to a child tell a story? What did you hear?

What is a biblical story that connects with your own story?

What is your story? Where are you GOING to share your story?

A biblical story that connects with my own is the story of Moses. Specifically, I think of Miriam being helpful to her little brother. The following is a retelling of Exodus 2 is from *Grandma's Gospel* by Scharlotte Rich:

A very long time ago in Egypt, an evil king called Pharaoh made God's people, the Hebrews, work very hard as slaves. Pharaoh thought there were too many Hebrews, so he made a terrible law that all Hebrew boy babies were to be thrown into the river and killed. One brave mother hid her little son at home for three months. But the day came when she couldn't hide him any longer. Then she had an idea. She made a small basket and covered it with tar so it would float. Then she carefully hid her baby in the basket in the thick, tall grass by the Nile River. But she couldn't stand around and watch him, because Pharaoh's soldiers would find the baby and kill him! What could she do?

The baby had a sister whose name was Miriam. Miriam wanted to help. "I love my little brother dearly," said Miriam. "I will pretend to work and play down by the river. I will watch over my little brother and not let anything or anybody hurt him."

"I don't know," said her mother. "You are so young, and it is dangerous. What will I do if you get caught? You will have to be very smart and very careful!" \

"I will pray, and God will help me." said Miriam. "I am not afraid." So the sister watched over her little brother as his small

basket floated in the river. Suddenly, her heart jumped and she couldn't breathe! Pharaoh's daughter was walking down by the river with her servants! She was coming to take a bath. She saw the basket and told her servants to bring it to her. When she opened the basket, the frightened baby cried. The princess felt sorry for him and said. "Oh. This must be one of the Hebrew babies. He is wonderful! I shall keep him!" Miriam was afraid, but she thought quickly! She bravely ran up to Pharaoh's daughter and smiled. "May I please help?" she asked, "I could find a woman to take care of the baby for you!"

"Yes, that would be good!" said the princess. So, Miriam ran and brought back her own mother, the baby's real mother! Now the mother was able to safely care for her baby at home until he grew older. But then she had to take him to the palace to live with the princess. That must have been very hard for her and Miriam. Pharaoh's daughter named the boy Moses, which means, "he came out of the water." Young Moses lived in the palace and was treated as her royal son. He grew up to become a great leader of God's people.

I have been on many mission trips where what we did helped others and even changed lives. I remember one year when we were in Mississippi, and we helped clean up the community building that had been destroyed by Hurricane Katrina. Little kids from the neighborhood came to see what we were doing, and we very excited that the center might be open again. They shared stories of what it was like before the hurricane and were excited to create more in the future.

In the story, Miriam helped her family by caring for her little brother. Trusting in God's protection, she made sure Moses would be able to live. Share this story with a little one in your life and see what stories they share in return. You may learn something new about that child and about the well-known story of Moses.

Recipes

Many commented on the delicious pot luck dishes and Kay Jones and Diana Johnson have graciously agreed to share their recipes:

Strawberry Pecan Pretzel Salad (Kay Jones)

1 cup crumbed Pretzels (I use more, like 2 cups)

½ cup chopped Pecans

3/4 cup Brown Sugar

3/4 cup Butter

3 cups diced Strawberries (I use frozen sliced strawberries thawed)

8 oz. Cream Cheese softened

½ cup Sugar

1 tsp. Vanilla

16 oz. Cool Whip

Mix together pretzels, pecans, brown sugar, & butter. Spread on large baking sheet; bake @ 400 degree oven for 7 minutes. Allow to cool, then break into small pieces. Can make ahead and store in an air-tight container.

Beat together softened cream cheese, sugar, & vanilla. Fold in Cool Whip, store in refrigerator.

Before serving stir in strawberries & sugared pretzels.

Meatball recipe (Diana Johnson)

1 lb. ground beef

1/2 c. milk

1/2 c. dried bread crumbs

1 tsp. salt

1/8 tsp. freshly ground black pepper

1-2 tsp. dried parsley

Combine ingredients and shape into balls. Arrange in pan and bake in 400 degree oven 20 min.

To make sauce dice fine 1 medium onion and 1/2 green pepper, slice 1/4 lb. mushrooms and sauté all in 3 Tbs. butter.

Sprinkle 1/2 tsp paprika & 2 Tbs. flour over contents of skillet. Pour in 1 cup beef stock, stirring constantly until mixture thickens.

Blend in 1/2 c. sour cream & add 1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce. Salt & pepper to taste.


