only way we can express our love. But even more problematic than following into that trap is when we use our holiday spending as a way to try to fix relationships.

Family relationships are notoriously difficult. It is only natural that the people who sometimes know us the best stress us the most because they have experienced us at our best and our worst. Likewise, we have experienced them at their best and their worst and everywhere in between. Disagreements and hurts over all kinds of things may have strained our relationships or continue to push our buttons.

If this is the case for you, it is nothing to be ashamed over or to try to overcompensate for. Also, don't feel like you have to put yourself in a situation that is unhealthy for you. Take care of yourself and those you love.

And remember, what we are celebrating this time of year is the truest of true loves: the love of God for us that became a real flesh and bone person in Jesus Christ. This love is worth more than we might responsibly or irresponsibly spend on our family and friends that time of year. This love has the power to change us and others. When we have those difficult people to love we can entrust them to the loving care of God and hope that if nothing else we can show them kindness. And I hope that you receive kindness in return.

It is also my hope and prayer that as you spend time in celebrating this season, that you experience love. Not just love from friends or family. But the love of God that is unchanging, unending, and unsurpassable. This love, Jesus Christ, was born for you today.

Feeding the Future

In Malawi, a densely populated country in southeast Africa, many children—especially those 5 and younger—don't receive enough food.

But ELCA World

Hunger and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Malawi (ELCM) are working together to end child hunger through a feeding center that touches 60 of the church's congregations. The center is supported, in part, by grant from ELCA World Hunger.

"Feeding centers are indeed a lifeline for many orphans and other vulnerable child[ren], especially in poor and hard to reach communities," says Mable Madinga, ELCM general secretary and Diakonia director.

In fact, there are 1.8 million children in Malawi orphaned each year because their parents die of HIV and AIDS, Madinga says.


While the overall goal of this program is to help reduce malnutrition in children 5 and younger, it also provides nursery schools to promote early childhood development and a mobile clinic.

Madalitso, now 25, benefited from this program as a child. He lost his father before birth, and his father's relatives took possession of the family's house, leaving Madalitso and his mother homeless. Fortunately, when Madalitso's mother took him to her home village, she heard about the feeding center and enrolled him immediately.

"That was the beginning of my new life," he recalls. Thanks to your support of ELCA World Hunger, young children in vulnerable situations receive the food, education and health care they need to grow and thrive.

"My life through the feeding center has helped me to work hard, form stable relationship[s], develop a sense of responsibility, consideration and self-control," Madalitso says. "I sincerely thank ELCM for the support through my life."

SWEDE HOME FOOD PANTRY



The Evangelism and Outreach Team oversees a nonperishable food and personal care item collection. You are welcome to bring donations at any time. ***Please place items you wish to donate in the basket located in the entry way of the church.***

Calvary Christmas Program


Calvary's Christmas Program will be Sunday, December, 16th during worship. Come hear the children tell the story of the birth of Jesus.

Bible Study

As ELCA Lutherans, we believe that the Bible is the inspired word of God. But what does that mean?

Rachel Held Evans is a best-selling author who has wrestled with faith and what it means to live that faith in our current society. In her latest book, she explores how we read and interpret the Bible.

This is what the blurb about the book has to say about it:

If the Bible isn't a science book or an instruction manual, then what is it? What do people mean when they say the Bible is inspired? When Rachel Held Evans found herself asking these questions, she began a quest to better understand what the Bible is and how it is meant to be read. What she discovered changed her--and it will change you too.

Drawing on the best in recent scholarship and using her well-honed literary expertise, Evans examines some of our favorite Bible stories and possible interpretations, retelling them through memoir, original poetry, short stories, soliloquies, and even a short screenplay. Undaunted by the Bible's most difficult passages, Evans wrestles through the process of doubting, imagining, and debating Scripture's mysteries. The Bible, she discovers, is not a static work but is a living, breathing, captivating, and confounding book that is able to equip us to join God's loving and redemptive work in the world.

Join us for a study of this amazing book as we seek to better understand Scripture and to grow together in our faith. We will meet on Tuesday evenings during January and February at 7pm at Swede Home. We will begin on Tuesday, January 8th, 2019. Books are \$12 and are available from Pastor.


