# Rye Happies – Marla Teegerstrom

Preheat oven 350 degrees

There is no wheat, no milk, no butter

(To double the recipe the ingredients are listed in parentheses)

1 cup rye flour (double recipe 2 cups)

1 cup chopped walnuts (2 cups)

1 cup firmly packed brown sugar (2 Cups)

1 cup quick cook oats (2 cups)

½ tsp salt (1 teaspoon)

½ cup cooking oil (1 cup)

2 eggs (4 eggs)

½ Tsp vanilla (1 Tsp)

9x9 pan lined with parchment or greased (jelly roll pan if doubling) bake 20-25 minutes

Take out of pan after 10 minutes (turn upside down on foil should come right out) cut into squares and dust generously with powdered sugar

#### **GIVING TREE**


Last year, many of you donated to help needy families served by ESU 7. <u>Thank you!</u> They were very thankful and moved by your generosity.

#### Spiritual Practice: Body Prayer

Body Prayer is an age-old practice that engages our entire body in prayer, both physically and spiritually. Moving into intentional positions while practicing breathing and prayer can help us stay focused and centered in our prayer time. This practice is great for young and old alike and can always be adapted to our own unique abilities. Check out the two Body Prayer practices shared below. Joyce Rupp and Deborah L. Sheehan share helpful guides in this practice.

Six Gestures of Morning Prayer: Taken from *Out of* the Ordinary by Joyce Rupp

1. We offer the Creator praise and gratitude: *Stretch your arms high and wide above your head.* 

# I thank you, Holy One, for the gift of another day of life.

2. We intentionally become aware of our spiritual bond with all of creation: Hold arms out from your sides, a little below shoulder height. Pivot to the left and to the right with your arms stretching outward the cosmos.

# I reach out in compassion to my sisters and brothers throughout the universe.

3. Offering my life to the Holy One: Stretch your arms out straight in front of you, slightly apart, palms up.

#### I give to you all I am and all I have.

4. Opening to accept what the Holy One offers me this day: *Pull your hands close together and cup them as container.* 

I open my entire being to receive the gift that you have waiting for me in this new day.

5. Remembering to be kind to our planet Earth: *Bend over, reach down, and touch the floor.* 

I touch this planet, Earth, with awe, reverence, and gratitude, promising to care well for her today.

6. Awareness of the indwelling presence of the Holy One: *Stand with crossed hands over your heart, and bow forward.* 

May I be united with you throughout this day, aware of your love strengthening me and shining through me.



#### FALL BOOK STUDY

Over the last months of October and November, members of Augustana and Calvary gathered throughout the week to discuss Rev. Dr. David J. Lose's book *Making Sense of the Cross* (Augsburg Fortress, 2011).

We had two groups meet each week. Once at Augustana in Genoa on Tuesdays at noon and again on Thursday evenings at Calvary. We had over a dozen people between the two each week. Having two sessions each week allowed some members from one church attend the study at the other church. Regulars at Augustana included Jane and Dave Baxa, Stacy Nelson, Sadie Micek, Abigail Vetick, and Cheryl Jones (of Calvary). Meeting at Calvary were Linda and Don Fuhr, Wayne Johnson, Deb and Mike Cramer, Diana Johnson, Sandy Johnston, Kay Jones, Elaine Westring, Janelle Udey, Lisa Oquist, Gia Adelson, Deb and Layne Hanquist, and Scotty Andreasen (of Augustana).

This book study focused on the various "Theories of Atonement" that Christians throughout the years have believed. We began by reading the Passion Narratives of all four gospels. This helped us understand that even the Holy Scriptures talk about Jesus with multiple perspectives. We also learned that "Atonement" means "at-one-ment," and it is what Jesus does for us on the cross to bring us back into right relationship with God. It turns out that there are many ways that people have understood what exactly it means for us when we talk about Jesus and the cross. The author encourages us to use four questions to help guide any discussion about atonement. 1) What does a theory say about who God is or what God is like? 2) What does a theory say about the human condition—what is broken? 3) What does Jesus do to repair what is broken? 4) What does a theory say about how Christians are to live in response to atonement?


These four questions, along with the text and accompanying videos, guided us as we learned about the different theologians and their ideas about various atonement theories, like "Ransom and Victory"; or Anselm of Canterbury's idea of "Substitution" or its close relatives of "Sacrifice" and "Satisfaction"; Peter Abelard's theory of "Example and Encouragement"; and even Lose's own suggestion of "Event and Experience."

I am so grateful for the opportunity to facilitate discussion about this engaging text. The material, at times, was challenging, but everyone was open to hearing new ideas. We even, sometimes often, found ourselves disagreeing with the thinkers—and sometimes each other—but recognizing always that we are all members of God's Church, saved by grace, and loved by God.

This is a study I think we will offer again in the future—but you can always read the book on your own. Just reach out if you're interested. As well, Pastor Hillary hopes to offer another brief study during the season after Epiphany (Jan – Feb) before Lent begins. So be on the lookout for more information coming soon!
