MESSAGE FROM PASTOR KIM

On Sunday, January 7 in worship, we each received a star word for the year. The star word we received is simply a word for us to focus on during the year or a word that



can be a source of inspiration for us. The tradition of receiving star words is one that challenges and invites us to be open to God's presence and God's guidance. As such, it is helpful to put your star word somewhere where you will see it on a daily basis.

My star word is on my desk propped up against the container of pens, pencils, and highlighters that sits in the corner. The word I received this year was responsibility. I am eager and excited to see how this word continues to speak to me and challenge me in the coming year. So far, it has already lead to some good reflection and interesting thoughts.

My first reflection came when I looked up the definition of the word. Even though I knew what responsibility meant, I looked it up to better engage with the word. At that time, I thought, well this will be something to remind me to be responsible this year, making sure I stick to my commitments and don't forget to put things on my calendar which causes me to miss them. Pretty straight forward and simple, right?

But as this word has sat on my desk longer, I have started to see it speaking to me in other ways. It has challenged me to think about what I am responsible for and to make sure that I am living up to those commitments. New land, new life

Between 1975 and 1979, the Khmer Rouge regime in Cambodia killed an estimated 3 million people—about 25 percent

of the population. Unfortunately, civil strife continued even after Khmer Rouge had been ousted from power, leaving landmines throughout much of the country's rural areas.

Touteint survived the Khmer Rouge years, but without land or steady income, life was far from easy. "I lived in the same house as my son," she says, " and I had to go to the streams and catch crabs and other small animals to try to sell at the market. Life was so unpredictable then."

After most of the landmines had been cleared, the Cambodian government began distributing land to those without any. To help them prepare their soil for agriculture, the organization Life with Dignity, with help from ELCA World Hunger, provided training and resources to new landowners

Most farmers wait for the rains to start planting crops, but Touteint started during the dry season. She chose to grow cassava, a plant resistant to drought. Cassava is simple to plant and grow, but unlike large commercial farms, Touteint has chosen not to use fertilizer. She hoped that this would make for an appealing product in the market.

Now, in addition to cassava, Touteint also has mango, jack-fruit, onions, and chickens in the garden around her own home.

ELCA World Hunger partners with Life with Dignity to support Touteint and others like her as they build homes and livelihoods. Your gifts are making an impact as our Cambodian neighbors create sustainable livelihoods for themselves and their families.

SWEDE HOME FOOD PANTRY


The Evangelism and Outreach Team oversees a nonperishable food and personal care item collection. You are welcome to bring donations at any time.
