CELEBRATING MINISTRY OF CALVARY LUTHERAN CHURCH

Go and... The Nebraska Synod met at the end of May for our annual meeting. While all the happenings can be found in Pastor Hillary's article later in this month's newsletter, I want to highlight the theme we as a Nebraska Synod will focus on over the next year. In Matthew 28:16–20, a passage often called the Great Commission, Jesus tells the disciples to go and make disciples of all nations, to baptize in the name of the Triune God, and to teach them everything Jesus has commanded. So too does Jesus say this to us: "Go!" Or, more specifically, "Go, and... do *something* for the kingdom of heaven."

Each month we, as a synod of some 90,000 believers, will focus on a different aspect of "Go, and..." Our Bishop as well as the rest of the synod staff and so many ministry leaders across the state are providing resources for congregations and individuals to explore the many ways we go and... share, serve, ask, rest, and more.

In June, the focus was **prayer**. While June wraps up soon, it is never too late to reflect on this spiritual practice. I pass along some questions asked by our synod:

What is your big prayer at this time?

What is going on in the lives of your neighbor? How can you pray for them?

Where will you GO and... grow your prayer life this month?

In July, we focus on go and... **listen**. This spiritual practice seems to get harder and harder every day. We're so often expected to have all the right words and answers, and to have opinions formed before we even know what's going on. Yet scripture time and again encourages us, as disciples, to listen more than we talk: to listen to ourselves, to our neighbors, and to God. Take some time to consider these questions:

What is something you learned from listening to your heart?

What is something you learned from listening to a stranger?

In a year of GOING, how will you listen to those around you?

When we listen, we find our so much that we can imagine. We learn history and stories of our neighbors. We gain different perspective. We grow as disciples. We might even discover something about ourselves

Apple Pie Torte

1 cup sugar, 1/4 cup oleo—creamed these ingredients together,


then add 1 egg., 1/2 tsp salt, 1 tsp soda, 1 1/2 tsp cinnamon, 1 cup flour...

Add 1/2 cup nuts, 2 1/2 cups diced apples.

Pour into a large greased pie pan and bake at 325 degrees for 50 minutes.

SAUCE:

1/2 cup oleo, 1/2 cup cream, 1/2 cup brown sugar, 1 tsp vanilla. Cook until thick. You may double the sauce ingredients so that there will be plenty!!
