CELEBRATING MINISTRY OF CALVARY LUTHERAN CHURCH



The season of Lent has developed over the many centuries since the crucifixion.* The early church settled on the familiar fast of forty days leading up to Easter after the Council of Nicaea in 325 AD. However, these forty days have been observed and held multiple foci for many generations of

Christians.

In the centuries after Nicaea, Lent was the primary time of preparation for people who wanted to become Christian to be baptized at Easter. In baptism, the believer dies and rises with Christ. Thus, Easter was an obvious day for baptismal celebration. However, by the time of the Medieval Church, when Christianity was the dominant religion and many were baptized as infants, the Lenten focus shifted away from baptismal preparation. Reverence towards Christ's passion on behalf of humanity's sinfulness turned the Lenten observation toward penance. In honor of Christ's suffering, believers suffered too by fasting from the comforts of food, drink, and more. Today, many Christians have lessened the intensity of Medieval fasting, though many still give something up, eat fish on Fridays, and have other traditions during the season. Instead, today's church has refocused on the baptismal imagery and renewal of Lent. Even with this diversity across the generations of Christians, a common theme of almsgiving, praying, and, yes, fasting has always been part of the Lenten journey.

In other words: Lent has always been a time of intention. Be it preparation for baptism or remembering the significance of the crucifixion, Lenten observation has intentionally reinforced faith, spirituality, and church community. In whatever way that you, your family, and your church has decided to observe Lent and prepare for the Great Three Days (Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday), you are encouraged to be intentional. This means showing up, being present, and diving deep as a disciple of Jesus Christ. Be intentional in your almsgiving. Be intentional in your prayer. Be intentional in your fasting.



Recipes

Sugar Cookies are always a treat, especially at Easter. Our thanks to Ben Carlson for providing this recipe from his Grandmother's Great Aunt Jean. She was born in Hylleholt, Denmark in 1900. She lived to be 93. Ben met her in 1986 when she baked these cookies for Ben's mom and him. Her mother would bake these for her when she was a child. They are sweet, crispy, and delicious!!

Sugar Cookies

2 cups Sugar

1 cup Margarine

1 cup lard (Crisco shortening)

2 eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 teaspoon almond extract

4 cups flour

1 teaspoon baking soda

1 teaspoon cream of tartar

½ teaspoon of salt

Cream sugar, margarine, and lard together.

Add eggs, vanilla, and almond extract. Mix well

Add flour, baking soda, cream of tartar and salt. Mix well

Roll into balls the size of a walnut.

Flatten with a glass dipped in sugar

Bake at 350 degrees for about 12 minutes
