Go And... As our summers come to a close and the autumn winds bring with them cooler mornings, changing colors, and all the smells of fall, we return again to the Nebraska Synod's year-long initiative of "Go, And!" This program opened in June and July with meditation

and introspection. We focused on prayer and listening respectively. In August, after much prayer and listening, we were invited to begin sharing our stories.

In sharing your own story, I hope you also heard the stories of others. In those sacred, vulnerable moments of witness and truth, we hopefully continued the practice of listening and prayer. As you might be noticing, an idea behind "Go, And…" is that it is recursive—these spiritual practices build upon one another. Likewise, our intentional observations and practice of "Going, And…" builds us as disciples of Christ.

So, after praying, listening, and sharing, we are now encouraged to respond in service—specially service with our neighbor. The focus is not simple charity, but intentional accompaniment and community. Its two-fold: we consider (1) who our neighbor is and (2) what response, or act of service, can we do *together*? So **go and** be in community; know your neighbors; serve with them; and grow in the tender compassion of the Lord, Our God.

Some other questions to consider: Who is your neighbor? How do you know? What did you discover in walking with your neighbor? As you GO with your neighbors, how do you describe your vocation?

Prayer: God of Accompaniment, you meet us where we are at. Help us meet our neighbors wherever they might be and walk with them. Amen.



Q150 Mission update

Special offering for Q150 totaled \$2,800.00. Thank you for your generosity to give to others as we celebrate our faith.

The 4 schools in the county, Shelby-Rising City, Osceola, Cross County, and High Plains, each receive \$700 for their back to school supplies for students and classroom or for items deemed necessary by their staff and administration.

There has been some conversation regarding what we can do to help with the devastating fire on the Island of Maui.

Multiple wildfires have broken out on the Hawaiian island of Maui. Exacerbated by strong winds, wildfires on Maui have claimed dozens of lives and have destroyed homes, businesses and lines of communication. Thousands of people are under evacuation orders, some moving to other Hawaiian islands. Wildfires have also affected the Big Island of Hawaii, and the islands remain vulnerable to more fires this season. Lutheran Disaster Response is coordinating with the Pacifica Synod and other partners to assess the needs of people impacted by the wildfires. We will work with them to provide for immediate needs and recovery amid the widespread destruction

We will have a special offering plate at the back of the church for the next several Sundays. If you would like to make a donation, please do so, we will send one check directly to Lutheran World Relief—Maui fires.
